

Prof. Fary Khan and Disaster Rehabilitation. What it takes to provide it?






 Erica Bleakley, Occupational therapist who works with NCCTRC (National Critical Care and Trauma Response Centre) and AUSMAT (Australian Medical Assistance Team) gave short presentation about her experience in providing disaster relief in Australia, Pacific and other regions which is co-ordinated through DFAT (Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade).

Some takeaways from the talk

- Importance of local capacity building
- Having deployable teams that are self-sustaining and have members with a wide range of skills including core competencies (Burns, SCI, amputee rehab) and have experience in working in austere environments.



Learning points


- □ Sustainability through education and capacity building locally

Create a pool of experts in Disaster Rehabilitation , who can be called upon for advice, online consultation and education
Continue DRC working group focus on Disaster research, Communication, Impact of climate change
Consolidate disaster response resources including resources on ISPRM website
Closer liaison with UNLC (United Nations Liaison Committee)
Continue collaboration with the Ukraine Rehab colleagues
Study the impact of Covid-19 on the health sector and rehabilitation efforts for long covid impairments
Strengthen health systems especially in resource limited countries and ensure that rehabilitation services are integrated into disaster preparedness and response plans.
